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ARTICLES OF CONVERSION

BARROW UTILITIES AND ELECTRIC COOPERATIVE, INC.

ARTICLE I

These Articles of Conversion are executed under the provisions of A.S. 10.25.010-10.25.650, the Alaska Electric and Telephone Cooperative Act.

ARTICLE II

The name of the corporation prior to its conversion into a utilities and electric cooperative was "BARROW UTILITIES, INCOR-PORATED". The address of the corporations principal office prior to its conversion to a utilities and electric cooperative was Post Office Box 444, Barrow, Alaska 99723.

ARTICLE III

The corporation was organized under A.S. 10.15.005-10.25.660, the Alaska Cooperative Corporation Act.

ARTICLE IV

The corporation elects to become a cooperative, non-profit, membership corporation subject to A.S. 10.25.010-10.25.650.

ARTICLE V

The name of the cooperative is BARROW UTILITIES AND ELECTRIC COOPERATIVE INC.

ARTICLE VI

The address of the principal office of the cooperative is Post Office Box 444, Barrow, Alaska 99723.

ARTICLE VII

ARTICLE VIII

Membership in the cooperative shall be as follows:

- 1. All members of Barrow Utilities, Incorporated as of the date of the execution of these Articles of Conversion shall be members of the cooperative without the necessity of the payment of an additional membership fee.
- 2. All persons not qualifying for membership under Section 1 of this Article, who agree to use electric energy or other utilities furnished by the cooperative may become members of the cooperative. Applicants shall be admitted to membership upon the payment of a TWENTY-FIVE DOLLAR (\$25.00) membership fee, which is not refundable, and who meet such other qualifications and limitations of membership as may be prescribed in the bylaws.

Membership in the cooperative shall not be transferable.

ARTICLE IX

Each member of the cooperative shall have one vote. Meetings of the membership and voting by the membership shall be as provided in the bylaws of the cooperative.

ARTICLE X

The duration of this cooperative shall be perpetual.

ARTICLE XI

The purposes for which this cooperative is incorporated and the powers which it may exercise are:

- 1. To exercise all powers of an electric cooperative as provided in A.S. 10.25.010 or any amendents thereof.
- 2. To generate, manufacture, purchase, acquire, accumulate and transmit electric energy, and distribute, sell, supply and dispose of electric energy to its members, to governmental agencies and to political subdivisions, and to other persons not exceeding ten percent (10%) of the number of the members of the cooperative; provided that the cooperative may continue to serve persons, with said services not in excess of forty percent (40%) of the number of its members, who are already receiving service from the cooperative electric facilities without requiring them to become members. The persons so served may become members upon the terms provided in these articles and in the bylaws.
- 3. To exercise any power, not herein enumerated and contained in A.S. 10.25.020 or any amendments thereof.
- 4. To purchase, acquire, store, distribute, sell, supply, and dispose of natural gas or other utility services, not heretofore mentioned, to members and non-members of the cooperative.
- 5. To do all other acts necessary to carry out the purposes above stated, including but not limited to:
 - a. purchase, hold, process, deliver, sell, and charge for electric, gas and other utility services and provide other products and services

necessary or incidental to its operations; sue and be sued; make contracts and incur liabilities; borrow money at such rates of interest and under tracts and incur liabilities; borrow money at such rates of interest and under such terms as the bylaws may provide or the Board of Directors may determine; establish and maintain capital revolving funds, capital reserves, issue notes, bonds and other obligations, issue certificates of equity or indebtedness for credits in deferred patronage refunds or capital reserves, and secure any obligations by mortgage or pledge of all or any property or income;

- b. assist members and patrons in the acquisition of appliances, equipment, apparatus, and fixtures necessary and proper for the use of the utility services offered by the corporation, and to assist them to prepare premises for installations, to finance, install, service, repair, and maintain the appliances, equipment, apparatus, and fixtures so utilized by patrons;
- c. construct, maintain and operate electric and natural gas lines, distribution or disposal systems for other utility services along, upon, under and across publicly owned lands and public thoroughfares, including without limitation, all roads, highways, streets, alleys, bridges, and causeways;
- 6. To exercise all powers of a cooperative organization within the meaning and limits of Section 501(c)(12) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1954.

ARTICLE XII

Apportionment and Distribution of Net Proceeds or Savings or Net Losses: The net proceeds or savings of this cooperative shall be apportioned, distributed and paid periodically in accordance with rules and regulations promulgated under Section 501(c)(12) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1954.

The bylaws shall contain provisions for the apportionment and charging of net losses.

Noncumulative interest not to exceed eight percent (8%) per annum may be paid on deferred or revolving patronage accounts when, if, and as specified in the bylaws.

ARTICLE XIII

Upon the dissolution of this cooperative, all debts and liabilities of the cooperative shall first be paid according to their respective priorities. The liquidated value of any property or assets which remain after discharging the debts and liabilities of the cooperative shall be distributed in accordance with rules and regulations promulgated under Section 501 (c)(12) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1954.

ARTICLE XIV

Amendments to these Articles of Conversion may be adopted under procedures conforming to the Alaska Electric and Telephone Cooperative Act.

Date of Adoption of Amendment - August 6, 1974

Amendment was adopted on June 13, 1974 by the Board of Directors with unanimous approval.
